Brad has just signed the affidavit, so the motion for a temporary restraining order and the motion to show cause will be filed in Champaign County later this week. North Lewisburg will be served shortly thereafter. The filing fee will be paid then billed to the Village.

5. FISCAL OFFICER REPORT

Total receipts for the month of June were \$15,968.55 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$15,087.91. Expenses include \$3,714 to Rusty Pence for work done to back up Ron and work done on park improvements. The portion of his time spent on park improvements is being charged to the American Rescue Plan fund. Another \$1,839 for rubber mulch shows as an expense, but the mulch hasn't been received yet and the check hasn't been sent. Receipts were 58.7% of plan through June, so we're ahead of plan on revenue.

The tax budget for 2025 will be considered as a resolution later in the meeting. This budget must be must passed annually by July 15 and submitted to the County Auditor by July 20. It should be considered a rough guide for the 2025 permanent budget for next year. Also for consideration later in the meeting is the annual resolution accepting the property tax amounts and rates. It's nearly the same as last year.

North Lewisburg's claimed sewer service balance is \$117,387.40.

Belcher moved and seconded by Morgan to accept the financial statements for June 2024 and approve June 2024 expenditures as presented by the Fiscal Officer.
