1. CALL TO ORDER – ROLL CALL

4. FISCAL OFFICER REPORT

Total receipts for the month of April were \$18,917.64 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$10,452.92. There were no unusual receipts during the month but we're running about 20% above budget ytd in the General Fund. Expenses included \$1,100 to McKeever to hydrovac a catch basin and manholes in March.

5. MAYOR'S REPORT

Dumpsters for community cleanup are scheduled to be on site Friday, Saturday, and Sunday this week. We're using Waste Management this year because we couldn't reach last year's contractor.

7. **VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT**

The Mayor met with Cheryl Hollingsworth, Mayor of North Lewisburg, to discuss the on-going sewer service contract negotiations. She received a letter from her shortly thereafter stating that \$28 is their best offer. The letter stated that their number is based on a calculation that Woodstock produces 17% of the wastewater processed. A copy was distributed to Council members. Herron stated that he would continue to gather data for a response. The recent chemical leak at their plant was discussed briefly.

Weidner asked about the problems Ron had with the dumpsters this year. The contractor used for the past several years wasn't returning Ron's calls and has reportedly moved to Columbus. Another company wanted the containers monitored constantly and stated that they would return any full container in which any prohibited items were found t. Another wanted to be paid up front with a credit card. Waste Management agreed to provide containers with reasonable terms. They will drop two units Friday but won't be able to replace full ones over the weekend.

None.


9. **NEW BUSINESS**

Weidner asked about the status of the playground equipment discussed last year. Belcher stated that a group of people in town are interested in making serious improvements in the park. He said that one resident is interested in starting a softball league involving surrounding villages. Herron stated that the new Baptist church has added commercial grade swings to the existing swing set and is interested in doing more. He cautioned that the ORC may call for a Board of Park Trustees if the Village wants to accept donations to maintain and improve a park within the Village limits. This would be a good idea because of the recent interest and the need to have some control over the safety and appropriateness of improvements initiated by residents. The Mayor asked what would be required to make the second swing set useable. Herron said that we would need to acquire the specs for anchoring it. Herron stated that the park is a public facility and may be used by anyone. He said that he would further research the statutory requirements.


