4. FISCAL OFFICER REPORT

Total receipts for the month of September were \$11,101.97 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$10,237.01. Expenditures included an unbudgeted payment of \$1,904 to N. Lewisburg to replace the warrant from last year that the bank will no longer accept, and \$447 to the Treasurer of State for the UAN quarterly user fee.

10. **ADJOURNMENT**


