FISCAL OFFICER REPORT 5.

Total receipts for the month of September were \$17,448.27 and expenditures were paid for the month totaling \$9,375.90. \$8,900 of the revenue was from municipal income tax collections. Expenditures included \$1,250 to Edwards Tree Service, \$1,600 for legal services, and \$792 to Koenig Equipment for routine service on the John Deere tractor. Revenue is significantly ahead of plan thanks in large part to the income tax.

North Lewisburg's most recent invoice (9/19/2024) shows a balance due of \$134,827.02.

Zizzo moved and seconded by Weidner to accept the financial statements for September 2024 and approve September 2024 expenditures as presented by the Fiscal Officer. Floor is open for discussion on motion.

6. MAYOR'S REPORT

Weidner stated that Woodstock Community Church has an interest in acquiring the fire truck. They state that they have a place to house it and have uses for it. Weidner believes that there is support on Council for donating it. Solicitor Boggs stated that she would research the legal ramifications of a donation vs. sale. Weidner stated that they would like to borrow it for events as an alternative. Liability was identified as an issue with borrowing it, unless a Village employee drives it.

7. PUBLIC

Resident Bryant Bailey, who is currently housing the fire truck in one of his buildings stated that he has no problem with housing it, but that he was told it was used for parades and it hasn't left his building in the several years it's been there.

A resident living on Burnwell stated that the street light across from 115 Burnwell is not working. Herron stated that the electric company will be notified as they are responsible for contracting maintenance of the lights.

Resident Sarah Buchanan stated that she was expecting a vote on the new zoning provisions tonight. Solicitor Boggs stated that new sewer connections can't be approved because of the situation with North Lewisburg. Herron stated that the cottage housing development issues to be voted on tonight only add "Cottage Housing Development" to the zoning ordinance. They do not approve any building activities. A formal application to the Board of Zoning Appeals would be required for that. Solicitor Boggs reiterated that no new connections could be allowed at this time. Resident Sarah Buchanan expressed dissatisfaction as she recently made an offer on a property with the intention of building on it.

In response to a question from resident Bryant Bailey, Herron gave a summary of the sewer contract's history and recent negotiations.

A resident asked about the 2-mill levy on the upcoming ballot in November. Details of the impact on homeowners and use of the funds were discussed.

A question was raised about use of the ballpark by a youth league. Herron stated that he is the contact for league use of the ballpark.


